What is it? How does it work?

The City of Vallejo has experienced significant increases in gun violence and violent crimes against men, women and children. The Vallejo Police Department (VPD) is committed to combatting these crimes to ensure that the vision of seeing Vallejo become a safe, vibrant and prosperous city is realized.

In order to address the issue of crime in our neighborhoods, VPD launched its Operation PEACE Project (also known as Predictive Enforcement and Community Engagement) in August 2020. The initiative promotes positive interactions and relationship building between officers and the community and also increases police visibility to deter crime in the city. Data-driven strategies that are precise and reduce harms is our focus.

The Operation PEACE Project includes a four-part plan focused on crime reduction and community policing - Redeployment, County, State and Federal Partnerships, Technology & Innovation Improvements and Community Engagement.

Neighborhood Watch Program (NWP)

The Neighborhood Watch Program (NWP) has historically proven to be one of the most effective crime prevention programs to date. The program organizes residents to work cooperatively with law enforcement, with a goal to deter criminal activities and secure safer neighborhoods.

The absence of neighborhood familiarity and relationships with one another, have contributed to an increase of certain types of criminal activities.

Local residents are the experts of their own neighborhood and are the best source of knowledge when it comes to identifying activities that are out of the ordinary.

As an organized NWP group, local residents are trained by members of the Community Services Division Crime Prevention Unit on how to identify, document and report criminal activities to the police department, without directly intervening or confronting suspected criminals. Each of our NWP groups are asked to designate leaders so that they can act as a liaison with the police department.

Neighborhood Mapping

One of the most important elements of a successful neighborhood watch is having the boundaries clearly defined. By defining the boundaries, it will be easier to identify homes that are involved and the homes that need to still be reached and informed of the watch group.

It will also allow neighbors to network together and identify problem properties that need to be monitored on a regular basis.

If there is a park or community center within the boundaries, neighborhood events can be held at these locations or in a neighbors home or yard.

Communication

Using the Nextdoor.com app as a way to keep in touch with your neighbors and stay in consistent communication with City Officials & Law Enforcement, is a good start.
